

Early Intervention and Prevention in Barnet

- Investing in early intervention and prevention to reduce the number of children and families experiencing complex problems
- Protecting the most vulnerable people from avoidable harm or abuse underpins everything we do

Early Identification, Assessment and Intervention



The effects of neglect begin early and remain throughout a child's life even into adulthood.

Widely accepted:

- Graham Allen review early intervention
- Frank Field review child poverty
- Munro reviewimportance of early identification and early help.

Implications for:

Society – early damage requires further support from social care, education, health, housing, police, and other services.

Individual - reduced life chances

Costs increase as needs increase Child looked after in secure accommodation -Child looked after in children's Cost per child / family £134,000 per year home - £125,000 per year Cost Multi-dimensional Treatment Foster Care - £70,000 per year Costs increase as children get older Child looked after in foster care - £25,000 per year Based on Family Intervention Projects national £8-20,000 per family per year figures, Parenting programme -£900-1,000 per family Family Nurse Partnerships -**ADCS** £3,000 per family per year Family Information Direct and DfE £33.86 per family via telephone helpline £1.95 per family via digital services Children's Centres - £300 for each 0-5 year old Schools - £5,000 per pupil Severity of need

Troubled Families Division

- Recent Government initiative from DCLG
- Family Support practitioners
- In Barnet division consists of:
 - Family Focus Team
 - Intensive Family Focus Team (FIP)

Putting What is a 'troubled family BOROUGH

- 120,000 troubled families nationally
- 705 troubled families identified in Barnet
- 3 criteria
 - Have an adult on out of work benefits
 - Children not in school
 - Involved with Crime and ASB
- High cost to public purse

Putting Framility Frocus model of WOLLER BOROUGH

- A dedicated caseworker with low case-loads to work intensively with the whole family
- whole family assessment and support packages to address whole family needs
- Adopting a challenge and support model of intervention
- Not imposing time limits on the intervention
- Exit planning and identifying ongoing support



Troubled Families Division

- Total team of 36 Family Support Practitioners
- Supervised by 6 Seniors in teams
- 12 Intensive Family Focus Practitioners- families needing support from 4 or more agencies
- 24 Family Focus practitioners-families needing support from 2 or more agencies

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Assessment Framework (CAF)

- Referrals to the Family Focus team through the completion of a CAF

 CAF assessment completed by IFF Practitioner with the family



The CAF Process

- A Pre-Assessment Checklist (to help identify when to undertake a CAF)
- The Common Assessment Form
- Referral tool to access more targeted support
- An action plan with built in review process
- The appointment of a Lead Professional
- Team Around the Child/multi-agency meetings

Putting the Complete CAF for? BAR LONDON



CAF should be carried out when:

- There is concern about how well a child or young person is progressing
- Their needs are unclear, or broader than one service can address on its own
- A CAF would help identify the needs and provide a basis for getting other services involved.



Multi-Agency Support Team (MAST) to provide CAF support

 CAF Duty Desk (Mon-Fri, 9-5) to deal with all CAF queries (including informing practitioners whether a CAF already exists for a child). Also to log CAFs and triage CAFs as referrals)

Multi-Agency Support Team (MAST)

The Team is made up of:

- 4x fte Multi-Agency Coordinators (MACs)
- 3 x CAF Social Workers and manager
- 3 x Safer Families Domestic Violence Workers

Putting the Community First Role of Multi-Agency Group's Construction (MAGs)

- Multi-Agency forum
- 'trouble-shoot' stuck CAFs/pre-CAFs and get CAF back on track
- chaired by senior managers from Children's Service
- representatives from all key stake-holders at a managerial level (inc. CAMHS, and Primary

Puttin Newurlogal CAF Form since Nov 2011

- Shorter and streamlined
- used as a referral as well as assessment tool
- parent/child indicators to chart distance travelled and show impact
- separate page for each child/family CAF

Putting the Computation Pathways BAR LONDON B



CAF used to refer to:

- Family Focus Team- since Nov 2011
- CAMHS Tier 3- since Feb 2012
- Early Years Vulnerable C/Ctre places- since April 2012
- Can also support referrals to other services

Putting the Romania der - CAFs used as RNET

referral tool

- Must provide enough relevant information to assist a team to allocate and prioritise the case
- be able to help the new Team 'hit the ground running' with the case
- be of good quality- the CAF is a 'live' document to support a family.
